

**PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY
BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES**

WHEREAS, Section 2.99 et seq., of the Marin County Code empowers the Assistant Director of Emergency Services, when assigned by the Director of Emergency Services, to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when said County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the County Board of Supervisors is not in session, and;

WHEREAS, said Assistant Director of Emergency Services does hereby find:

That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within said county, caused by WINTER STORM; which began on the 30 th day of DECEMBER, 2005; and;

That these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of said County, and;

That the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin is not in session and cannot immediately be called into session;

WHEREAS, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services has made every reasonable effort to confer with the Director of Emergency Services and/or with one or more members of the Board of Supervisors;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a local emergency now exists throughout Marin County; and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions and duties of the Director of Emergency Services, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services and the emergency organization of this County shall be those prescribed by state law, by ordinances, and resolutions of this County, and; That this emergency proclamation shall expire in seven days after issuance unless reviewed and ratified by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this proclamation be immediately forwarded to the Director of the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services.

PROCLAMATION REQUESTING THAT THE GOVERNOR PROCLAIM A STATE OF EMERGENCY AND REQUEST A PRESIDENTIAL DECLARATION BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services of the County of Marin found that due to winter storm and flooding, which commenced on the 31st day of December, 2005, a condition of extreme peril to life and property did exist in the County of Marin and all its cities, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with state law and Marin County code, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services proclaimed the existence of a local emergency throughout said county effective the 31st of December, 2005, and


WHEREAS, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services has made every reasonable effort to confer with the Director of Emergency Services and/or with one or more members of the Board of Supervisors;

WHEREAS, it has now been found that local resources are unable to cope with the effect of said emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that a copy of the Proclamation of Local Emergency be forwarded through the State Director of the Office of Emergency Service to the Governor of California with the request that he proclaim the County of Marin to be in a state of emergency; and further that the Governor request a Presidential Declaration.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that Farhad Mansourian, Director of Public Works, is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the County of Marin for the purpose of receipt, processing and coordination of all inquiries and requirements necessary to obtain available state and federal assistance.

A PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

I, **ARNOLD SCHWARZENEGGER**, Governor of the State of California, find that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist within the counties of Butte, El Dorado, Lake, Lassen, Marin, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Sierra, Siskiyou, Solano, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba, as a result of a series of severe rainstorms in that area that commenced on December 19, 2005. The series of storms brought unusually heavy rains that caused flooding, mudslides, the accumulation of debris, washed out and damaged roads, and the loss of human life. These counties have proclaimed local emergencies and have requested that I proclaim a state of emergency, because the magnitude of this disaster exceeds the capabilities of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of these counties. Under the authority of the California Emergency Services Act, set forth at Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 7 of the California Government Code, commencing with section 8550, I hereby proclaim that a State of Emergency exists within the counties of Butte, El Dorado, Lake, Lassen, Marin, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Sierra, Siskiyou, Solano, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba.

Pursuant to this proclamation, I hereby direct all agencies of the state government to utilize and employ state personnel, equipment and facilities for the performance of any and all necessary activities to alleviate this emergency as directed by my Office of Emergency Services and in accordance with the State Emergency Plan.

I **FURTHER DIRECT** that as soon as hereafter possible, this proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this proclamation.
