

# VOTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTERS VOTING BY MAIL

## TO CAST A VOTE FOR A MEASURE

Completely blacken the oval next to the word “Yes” or “No.”

### MEASURE A

Shall baseball games be played on Tuesdays?

YES       NO

## TO CAST A VOTE FOR A CANDIDATE

Completely blacken the oval that appears next to your choice.

### CITY COUNCILMEMBER

Vote for **ONE (1)**

- TED ROBINSON  
Baseball Player
- PEGGY FLEMING  
Figure Skater
- LANCE ARMSTRONG  
Cyclist

## VOTING OPPORTUNITIES

Note how many voting opportunities are allowed for each contest (vote for one, two, etc.)

**If you mark more ovals than are allowed, none of your votes for that contest will count.**

### IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE

on your ballot, call the Registrar of Voters for instructions. (415) 473-6456.

## TO VOTE

- Use a pen with black ink.
- Blacken the oval completely.
- Check both sides of the ballot.
- **DO NOT** vote for more candidates than allowed or none of your votes for that office will be counted.

## TO CAST A WRITE-IN VOTE

Only properly marked votes for **qualified write-in candidates** will be counted. If there are qualified write-in candidates, a list of them is available from the election official.

- Locate the office for which you want to cast a write-in vote.
- Blacken the oval next to the line for the write-in candidate.
- Print the name of the qualified write-in candidate on the line next to the oval.

### GOVERNOR

Vote for **ONE**

- GEORGE WASHINGTON
- ABRAHAM LINCOLN
- JOHN F. KENNEDY
- Thomas Jefferson

## TO CAST YOUR BALLOT

- When you finish marking your ballot, put it in the return envelope, sign the envelope, and write your return address on the envelope.
- Mail or deliver your ballot to the Registrar of Voters. Your ballot must be **RECEIVED** either by mail or at the polls by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day or it will not be counted.

# MAKE SURE YOUR VOTE COUNTS

## Top 3 reasons why your ballot may not count and what you can do about it

### 1. Ballot arrives too late - *Postmarks don't count*

Your ballot must **arrive** at the Elections Office or any polling place in Marin County by 8 p.m. Election Day

#### There are 3 ways to return your ballot:

- Mail it at least 5 days before Election Day, **or**
- Deliver it to the Elections Office during office hours, **or**
- Deliver it to any polling place in Marin County between 7am to 8pm Election Day.

### 2. No signature on return envelope

**SIGN** in the red box on your return envelope.

### 3. Signatures don't match

- Your signature on the return envelope must look like the signature on your voter registration card.  
*Do not print your name in the signature box unless you printed your name on your voter registration card.*
- If you are unable to sign your name, make an X and ask one witness to sign in the witness box.  
*A person with power of attorney may not sign for you because another person's signature on your envelope is not valid for voting.*
