

COUNTY OF MARIN HIV/AIDS RYAN WHITE SERVICES

- ◆ The Ryan White Treatment Modernization Act is federal legislation that addresses the unmet health needs of persons living with HIV disease (PLWH).
- ◆ The Ryan White Act is intended to help communities and states increase the availability of primary health care and support services.
- ◆ The priority is to ensure that clients ultimately receive primary care, which includes maintenance or initiation of treatment and adherence to medication regimens, leading to improved health outcomes.
- ◆ These services are intended for low-income, underinsured, and uninsured persons living with HIV.
- ◆ They are funds of “last resort,” meaning that all other funding sources for a service must be exhausted before using Ryan White funds for the service.

ELIGIBILITY FOR RYAN WHITE SERVICES

- ◆ The first time you go to receive Ryan White services, you will need to bring proof of identification, proof of residency, proof of HIV diagnosis, and proof of meeting low-income requirements. It is a federal requirement that all consumers provide proofs of eligibility each year.
- ◆ Ryan White services and medications are free for those with an income under \$43,560, regardless of immigration status.

Marin Treatment Center currently offers HIV/AIDS Case Management, Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment, and assistance with Residential Substance Abuse Treatment. To qualify, a client must be HIV-infected, a Marin County resident, and meet the economic income standards. Clients in the Medical Case Management program do not need to be substance abusers.
