## Is my polling place accessible?

We work hard at getting polling places that are accessible for all people. But sometimes this is not possible.

To know if your polling place is accessible:

- Find the access symbol on the back cover of your ~~Voter Information Pamphlet~~. 
- Look for the word YES, NO or USABLE near the symbol.
  - YES means your polling place **is** fully accessible.
  - NO means your polling place is **not** accessible.
  - USABLE means many people with disabilities may be able to use your polling place, but it does not meet all ADA requirements.
- If your current polling place is not accessible, and you want to vote at an accessible polling place, call us at least 2 weeks before the election: **(415) 499-6439**

## What kinds of support can voters get?

Each polling place has:

- A wheelchair accessible voting booth,
- Magnifiers,
- Pens with grips that are easy to hold,
- An **AUTOMARK**, an accessible voting device to help you mark your ballot independently and privately. A Sip and Puff device for use with the AUTOMARK is available on Election Day by calling (415) 473-6447.
- Curbside voting for voters who cannot get into the polling place. A poll worker can bring a ballot to you. After you vote, the poll worker will put your voted ballot in the ballot box.
